The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

Invocation

In the name of the Father, and of the Son †, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. *Apostles' Creed*

Opening Sentences

"Behold, I send my messenger, and he will prepare the way before me. And the Lord who you seek will suddenly come to his temple. (Mal3:1 ESV)

Luke 1:68-79

Catechesis Notes for the week

Happy New Church Year!

Advent begins with the First Sunday of Advent, at the end of November or the beginning of December. This is the beginning of the church year. There are always four Sundays of Advent, before Christmas, whether Christmas day falls on a weekday or a Sunday. The word 'Advent' means 'coming'. During this time, we look forward to our Lord's coming as a human baby at Bethlehem and also to his final coming as king at the end of time. We also remember his continual coming to his people in his word and sacraments. Advent is therefore a time of waiting, preparing, and hoping. This involves both repentance and joyful anticipation.

Candle 1 – The Candle of Hope (The Prophecy Candle)

We can have hope because God is faithful and will keep his promises made to us. Our hope comes from God. Candle 2 – The Candle of Peace (The Bethlehem Candle)

This candle symbolises the preparations being made to receive and cradle the Christ-child. He will come to bring peace. "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah,.... Out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times.... He will stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they will live securely, for then his greatness will reach to the ends of the earth. And he will be their peace." Micah 5:2, 4-5 NIV.

Luke 3:1-6

- What do you think John was doing in those years? Why?
- Why does Luke list all the political and religious figures in verses 1-3?
- How would you describe John's message and style (see also Matt. 3:1-12; Mark 1:1-18; John 1:6-8, 19-28)

Sunday 21 November Second Sunday in Advent



Malachi 3:1-4: By the mid fifth century BC, the people of Judah had more or less given up on the God of Israel. They did not experience the expected prosperity on their return from Babylon and so lapsed into half-hearted worship and cynical morality. In these verses the prophet predicts that God, in an act of grace, will send his special messenger before he himself comes to purify the worship and cleanse the lives of the people. With this cleansing, the people will again be able to serve in righteousness. John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord.

Phillipians 1:3-11: Paul expresses his joy in praise and thanks to God for the fellowship he had experienced with the Philippian believers in proclaiming the gospel. This wonderful quality continued in their witness of the gospel and in their support of him even though he was now in prison. He was confident that God would continue this work in them until the day of Jesus Christ. However, his constant continuing prayer was that they, living in God's love, might grow also in accompanying knowledge and insight. In this way they would be ready and prepared when Jesus comes again. This is when the righteousness which is by faith will show as a fruitful harvest.

Luke 3:1-6: Luke signifies the importance of the event of John the Baptist's preaching with very careful precision in marking the year. He further locates the place of John's ministry in God's long-term plan for salvation by citing the prophecy of Isaiah 40:3-5. In this figurative language it is clear that lives are to be straightened out and unnecessary hindrances to God's grace are to be removed. This process of turning in repentance to receive forgiveness was, and still is, the only proper preparation to receive God's Messiah.

What is Advent?

Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath originated among German Lutherans in the 16th century, by Johann Hinrich Wichern (1808-1881). He was a pioneer in urban mission working among the poor. During Advent, children at the mission school, would ask daily if Christmas had arrived. In 1839, he built a large wooden ring, with 20 small red candles and 4 large white candles. One small red candle was lit each weekday and Saturday. On Sundays a large white candle was lit.

The candles specifically symbolise hope, peace, joy and love and a white 'Christ Candle'.
